



VA POP

Veterans "#3 and #4" get new legs!!

Veterans John Cool and Steve Owens are the latest POP recipients. For those of you who have been living under a rock for the last few months, POP stands for percutaneous osseointegrated prosthesis. (Easy for me to say). It features a titanium rod surgically implanted into the bottom of the thigh bone. The rod allows a prosthetic leg to be securely attached without the need for a socket. Our researchers and surgeons have been perfecting the process for over a decade now. John is from Pennsylvania and Steve is from Kansas; both are now life-long friends bonded by this extraordinary experience. What used to take them 5 minutes with a traditional socket, now takes them about 10 seconds to hook on the new leg and stand up. No more ill-fitting prosthesis, sores or frustration, only excitement as they are able to do things they haven't been able to do for years with a traditional prosthesis. This is a VA-funded clinical trial, approved by the Food and Drug Administration. It will assess the feasibility and safety of the new implant in 10 VA patients over the course of several years.




